McCulloch v. Maryland

McCulloch v. Maryland , 17 U.S. (4 Wheat.) 316 (1819), was a U.S. Supreme Court decision that defined the scope of the U.S. Congress's legislative power and how it relates to the powers of American state legislatures .

This case, decided by the Supreme Court in 1819, asserted national supremacy vis Å vis state action in areas of constitutionally granted authority.

Maryland filed a suit against McCulloch in an effort to collect the taxes. The Supreme Court, however, decided that the chartering of a bank was an implied power of the Constitution, under the “elastic clause,” which granted Congress the authority to “make all laws which shall be necessary and proper for carrying into execution” the work of the Federal Government.

McCulloch v. Maryland Case Brief TestMax

McCulloch v. Maryland Summary. The Supreme Court ruled in favor of McCulloch and his employer, the Bank of United States. It found that a tax imposed by the state of Maryland on the Bank’s branch in the state was unconstitutional as a violation of the Supremacy Clause. Moreover, the Court held that Congress was given the power to establish a federal bank based on the “necessary and proper clause” of the Constitution.
